The live discussion hits hard: the imprisonment of Samurai Wallet devs Keonne Rodriguez (5 years) and William “Bill” Hill (4 years) isn’t just about one wallet. It’s a social-precedent that could criminalize *any* non-custodial privacy code... and the episode ties it straight to the open-source mining stack we all rely on for decentralization.

1. The Samurai Story in One Sentence (Plus the Tech That Got Them Jailed)

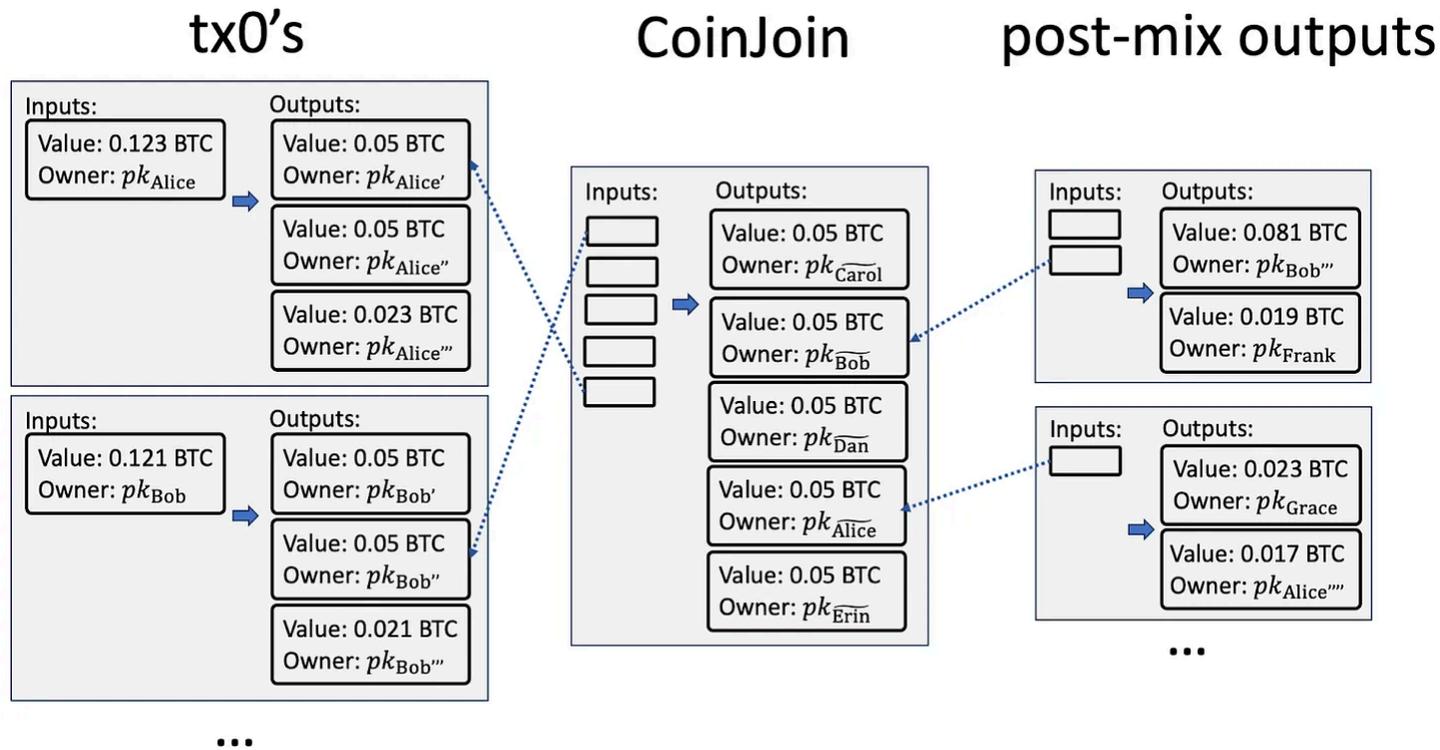
Samurai wasn't a centralized mixer — it was a **non-custodial mobile wallet** with built-in privacy tools. Many users ran their own Dojo full node; Whirlpool did **Chaumian CoinJoin** (5-person anonymous mixes); Ricochet added extra hops; Stonewall broke heuristics. DOJ called it an “unlicensed money transmitter” anyway, seized servers in 2024, forced a plea in 2025, and locked the devs up. Forfeiture: 6.3M paid+250k in fines each. Keonne is serving time in Morgantown, WV and Bill in an undisclosed prison right now.

Samurai Wallet interface (pre-seizure) — clean, powerful, and now gone from app stores.



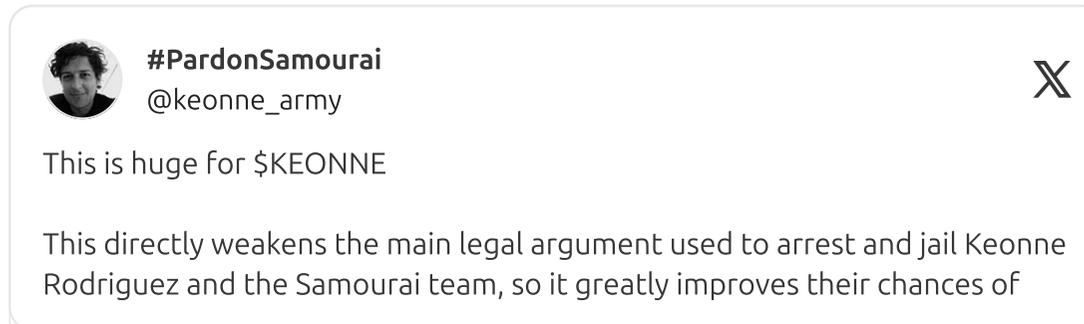
Whirlpool CoinJoin flow diagram: inputs → anonymous pool → post-mix outputs. No single entity can deanonymize.

2. Why This Case Threatens *All* of Bitcoin

- **Privacy precedent:** Even the U.S. Treasury just told Congress (March 2026) that “[lawful users may leverage mixers for financial privacy.](#)” That directly undercuts the DOJ’s theory — yet the devs are still in prison.

- **Open-source chilling effect:** Any dev shipping CoinJoin, Lightning privacy, or even advanced scripts could face the same “unlicensed transmitter” charge. Lightning compliance fears already mentioned in the episode. Going a step further, this novel legal theory could have implications for anyone using a software or hardware bitcoin wallet, running a node, or mining bitcoin; that’s how insane this legal theory is.
- **Fungibility death:** Without CoinJoin, chain analysis firms (and governments) win. Bitcoin stops being cash-like, putting people at increased risk of targeted attacks.
- **Mining tie-in:** The same freedom-tech ethos powers open-source mining firmware. If devs can be jailed for privacy code, what stops the next attack on mining tools?

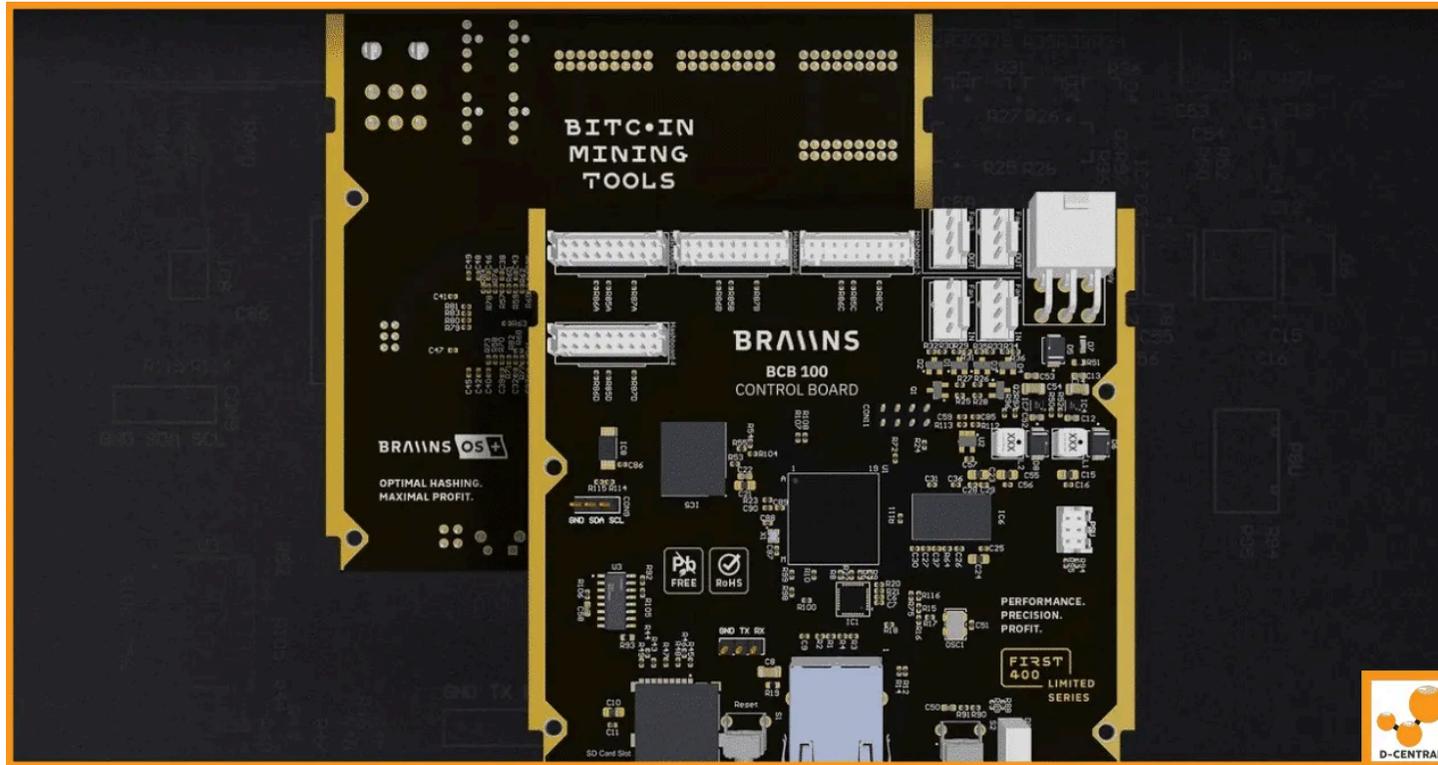
3. From Mixers → Miners: The Open-Source Mining Momentum

The episode pivots to the flip side of freedom tech: Mujina firmware (from the 256 Foundation) and Antminer hacks. This is the exact stack tech enthusiasts are running

right now to escape manufacturer lock-in and dev fees.

Stock vs. Mujina Firmware – Head-to-Head Table

Feature	Stock Bitmain Firmware	Mujina (Open-Source Linux/Rust)	Winner for Techies
Control	Locked, dev fees, no tweaks	Full fan/voltage/ASIC control	Mujina
Install	SD card only	Ethernet/USB flash via LuxOS (no SD needed)	Mujina
Drivers	Proprietary	Multi-ASIC (S19, Whatsminer, Avalon + EmberOne)	Mujina
Stratum	v1	Native Stratum v2	Mujina
Community	Manufacturer dictated	GitHub + OSMU Discord + AI-accelerated dev	Mujina



Example open-source control board (Braiins BCB-100 style) — the kind of hardware Mujina runs on stock Antminers.

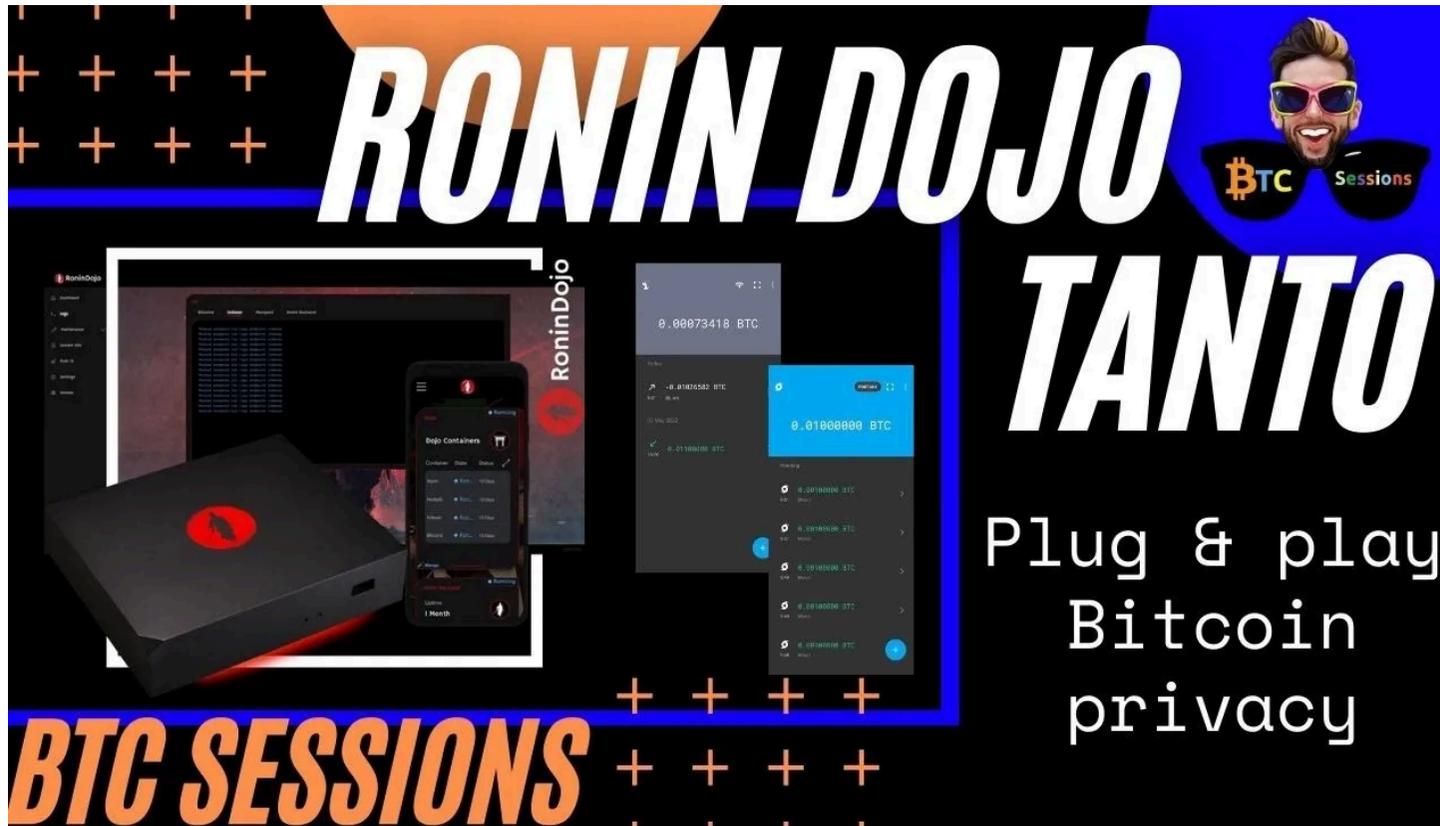


Custom firmware workflow illustration — exactly what Skot demoed live.

Bonus mentions: GrapheneOS shifts for secure miner phones, USB Wi-Fi hacks on Antminers, and AI speeding up firmware PRs. The 256 Foundation stack (Mujina + HydraPool + LibreBoard) is the path to truly decentralized hashrate.

4. Ronin Dojo – The Privacy Node That Ties It All Together

Samourai's Dojo backend runs perfectly on Ronin Dojo hardware: plug-and-play Bitcoin full node + Tor + Whirlpool coordinator in a box. Self-sovereignty in one device, see the video tutorial [here](#).

2. **Run the stack:** Install Sparrow/Electrum for recovery (Samurai seeds still work), spin up a Ronin Dojo or Mujina miner, test Ashigaru Whirlpool (community fork).
3. **Watch the fireside livestream** and support POD256 on Fountain/Zaprite.

Code is speech. Privacy is a feature, not a bug. Open-source mining is how we keep Bitcoin decentralized. The Samurai fight is *your* fight.

Stay sovereign. Sign the petition. Run a node. Mine openly. Repeat. ●
